

Scheduling Photo Sessions on the Farm



Any interested professional, part time, or amateur photographers must first <u>request</u> then be <u>granted</u> permission for their shoot and then <u>prepay</u> for their session. This ensures that we do not have too many photographers at once for the space allowed and your shoot does not coincide with any farm maintenance, private events, or other conflicts. Please note we do charge a daily fee of \$150 that will give you access to the farm from 9am to 5pm to use the hours how you see fit.

To schedule one or more days:

- 1. Check our website Photographer Page at www.doublemtreefarm.com
- 2. Select any available date for your photo shoot.
- 3. Pay the Photo fee by mailing a check or using a credit card over the phone. Call 740-765-4424
- 4. Read, print & sign the Agreement and Liability Waiver
- Email, mail or text a copy of your liability insurance AND the Agreement and Liability Waiver to <u>doublemtreefarm@doublemtreefarm.com</u> or Double M Tree Farm, LLC, 9627 State Route 152, Richmond, Ohio 43944 or 740-632-2308
- 6. Your spot will be secured once you pay the fee but proof of insurance must be received within 7 days or your spot will be cancelled and your fee refunded.
- 7. The DEADLINE to schedule an available spot is September 11th, 2020 even if there are spots open.
- 8. In the case of a rainout and <u>no client shots are done</u>, we will refund your fee or if possible, move you to another date. Note we do not refund for partial days. The fee is for any photo shoots on the farm that day.

Professional photographers are considered vendors sharing our space. Anyone who is taking pictures of others expecting a return, either in services or cash or photos or bringing props or equipment on the site is considered a professional photographer. This includes photographers for whom photography is not their primary source of income.

We are sorry we cannot allow sessions during Christmas Sales Season (Thanksgiving to Christmas). Please understand that during the sales season, even when we are not open to the public for tree sales, we are doing farm work. So, for safety and management reasons, we do not permit the public to be on the property.
